FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This Sunday at the 10:30 am mass our 2nd Grade girls and boys will celebrate their First Communion. It is a wonderful day for our community as they will share for the first time Christ's gift of Himself in the Eucharist. Lenten Racial Justice Journey: A Reflection By Aimee Wittman

Impacted. Challenged. Hopeful. Angry. Inspired. Privileged. Systemic. Messy. Stuck. Grateful. Guilty. Motivated. Changed. Called.

These are but some of the words that describe my personal experience engaging with the Lenten Racial Justice Journey readings, videos, and articles provided by the Social Justice Ministry at the College Church. I am struck by the com-



plexity of creating a racially just community, and discerning how, as a white Catholic in St. Louis, I am called by our Church to be a part of the healing process in this work.

I am meditating on what I have done, and what I have failed to do. As the mother of three young children, I am reflecting on how the choices that I make and the work that I do as a parent can either build up or break down racial justice. There are no easy answers to the many questions swirling around in my head, from questioning where I choose to live to where I choose to send my children to school to how I celebrate or do not celebrate diversity in my home, in my networks, or in my life. Hopefully the act of asking the questions is one step in the journey.

I hope I will try to listen more in this continued conversation and, in partnership with my husband and children, actively seek ways to encounter and engage with racial justice work in our community. I am also most grateful for the opportunity to encounter these readings and resources as a part of my Lenten journey.
