FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We celebrate the conclusion of the religious education year this Sunday. Though there is still Confirmation to celebrate on Pentecost, the programs conclude today. It is a perfect opportunity to give thanks for this wonderful ministry.

I thought it informative to give you some sense of the scope of our religious education program. We have almost 300 children involved drawing from about 150 families. They reflect the geographical diversity of College Church coming from all over the metro region. A small army of teachers, catechists, and volunteers ensure that everything runs smoothly. Saint Louis University is an essential partner with RE not only through the generous students who assist in classrooms, but by providing us space in the Business School.

One of the most important tasks of a parish is to form the faith lives of young people. We want them to know Christ so that they may bear fruit in abundance. The beauty is that this is the same mission we all have. I would suggest our young people in RE are not doing anything different than the rest of us. True disciples are being formed constantly. There is no completion or "graduation". What begins with our three year olds is an encounter with Jesus that will last their entire lives, just like it has for us.

CHILDREN’S RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Our Religious Education program is now accepting registrations for the 2018-2019 school year. Classes meet three to four times a month from September through May on Sunday mornings from 9:15am-10:20am. Children in grades Pre-School through Eighth are welcome. Sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion are part of our Second Grade program, as is Confirmation preparation in Eighth Grade.

Social justice is a strong component of our Religious Education program. All classes from Second Grade onward participate in a “Sandwich Sunday” in which they make sandwiches for the poor as they reflect on the lesson of the Good Samaritan. Students in Fourth Grade onward participate in Service Saturdays in which they visit homeless shelters, nursing homes, and other sites in order to serve those less fortunate and to learn about their experiences. Our religious instruction is interactive and engaging, with emphasis always placed on bringing children closer to God.
