FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today we celebrate Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The origins of this celebra-



tion are in 13th century France. That was a time when the Eucharist was honored greatly but very few people actually received Holy Communion. The Body of Christ was to be adored but not taken by the vast majority of Catholics.

Liturgical practice has changed over the centuries. We now believe the reception of Christ's Body and Blood is not a reward for good behavior, but rather the critical means to help us live our faith. If we limited reception of Communion to those who were worthy, none of us would be able to stand in line. As Pope Francis wrote, the Eucharist "is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak."

All the sacraments were instituted by Christ to lead the Church to growth in holiness. They are all gifts freely given, not because of any merit of ours, but because the love of Jesus is overwhelmingly generous. The Eucharist is perhaps the most tangible symbol of the utter gratuity of God's love for us.

Our participation in the Eucharist reminds us that our faith has nothing to do with who deserves what. This is about the very real presence of Emmanuel, God with us. The gift of Himself is what Jesus desires for us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.





FAIR TRADE/SISTER PARISH COMMITTEE UPDATE AND UPCOMING TRIP TO BELIZE

he fair trade/sister parish committee at College Church formed in 2007 with the goal of promoting fair trade practices and developing an understanding of the international Church. For ten years, College Church has had a sister parish relationship with the parish La Natividad in Santa María Chiquimula, Guatemala. Profits from our fair trade chocolate, coffee, and tea sales on first and third Sundays have gone toward La Natividad, with periodic communication to learn more about the parish and their programming. After careful discernment over the past year, the committee has determined that it is time to end our sister parish relationship with La Natividad, as lack of direct connection to the parish has made a relationship challenging to maintain. Our committee sent our final check with proceeds from fair trade sales.

Looking forward, the committee has determined that we will put our energy into building relationships between College Church and the two Jesuit parishes in Belize, which are in our province. From May 31 to June 11, a group of nine College Church leaders will visit Belize. The purpose of this trip will be to visit the two Jesuit parishes and learn more about the Jesuit works in Belize, while building relationships that we hope to continue after the trip. This group of leaders is tasked with sharing our experiences and leading efforts to discern next steps upon returning to St. Louis. Keep an eye out on the bulletin for more information on a presentation in the fall and ongoing opportunities to take part in efforts to connect with Jesuit works in Belize. In the meantime, first and third Sunday fair trade sales will continue. The committee will determine and communicate to the parish possibilities for where to next invest the profits from fair trade sales as we discern our next steps.
