#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The odor of sanctity you smell is me after my annual retreat last week. I spent my time praying in the holy land of south county at White House. Thanks to the staff at College Church for letting me get away knowing all would be well here.

Given the demanding pace of modern life, it can seem that time spent in prayer, let alone seven days on retreat, is an indulgence few of us can afford. I understand that work, family, and a million other claims on us can make even 15 minutes seem like a luxury. There is just too much of everything that makes us go non-stop with a few short hours for sleep squeezed in.

I am hardly the first to state such a way of life is unhealthy: physically, emotionally, mentally and spiritually. So what can be done? First off, there is no need to be discouraged or guilty. Start with our old friend the Ignatian Examen. That is a wonderful prayer that can bear fruit even if it only takes ten minutes at the end of our day.

Secondly, keep in mind that consistent prayer will actually aid the other parts of our lives. It is not problem-solving but rather an essential way to provide perspective and context. Prayer grounds us in what is most important to who we are as human beings. A good prayer life is no more decadent than getting enough sleep, eating well and exercise. It is our foundation.

## UPDATE FOR 2019-2020 COLLEGE CHURCH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN

Effective this year all children entering preschool, prekindergarten and kindergarten classes will be in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) program. This is a Montessori-based program where children work at their own pace as they learn to experience the love of God. Parents of children in grades first through eighth will have a choice of a traditional religious education program or the CGS program, although space in the CGS program is limited and priority will be given for families already in that program.

All religious education and CGS classes embrace the Jesuit tradition of love of God and service to others. Children come to appreciate God's love for them in various ways using Church teaching, and the people and environment around them. Starting in Second Grade each class spends one session making sandwiches for our neighbors as they study the Gospel story of the Good Samaritan. Beginning in Fourth Grade all classes have an outside day of service at an agency in our community.
