FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The 4th of July is the holiday has our attention this week. However, there is a wonderful Church feast the day before, that of St. Thomas the Apostle. The information on St. Thomas is fragmentary. Like most of the Twelve, we have only glimpses into his story. Thomas is most famous, or infamous, for doubting the Lord's resurrection. John's Gospel describes his disbelief. Thomas will not believe unless he touches Jesus' wounds himself. The next Sunday the Risen Lord is happy to oblige.

Tradition has it St. Thomas went east to proclaim the Good News. He is believed to have visited India and established the faith there. Chennai on the southeast coast is the site of his tomb. The veracity of this account is difficult to establish but what is certainly true is that Christianity in India is very old. Consider this: when St. Patrick brought the faith to Ireland the Church in India had been flourishing for centuries.

This historical truth is important. Scholars now talk about the emergence of a global Christianity no longer bound to Europe and North America. They are not wrong, but can fail to acknowledge our faith has ancient roots in places like India and certain African countries. It has always had a wide range of peoples, cultures and languages. The feast of St. Thomas is a nice reminder that the diversity of the Church is hardly new. It has been the case since Apostolic times.

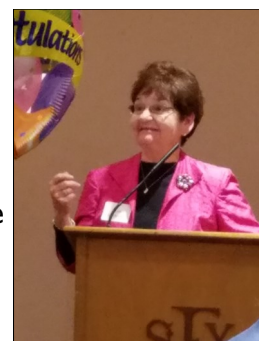
Volunteers Needed For Children's Religious Education

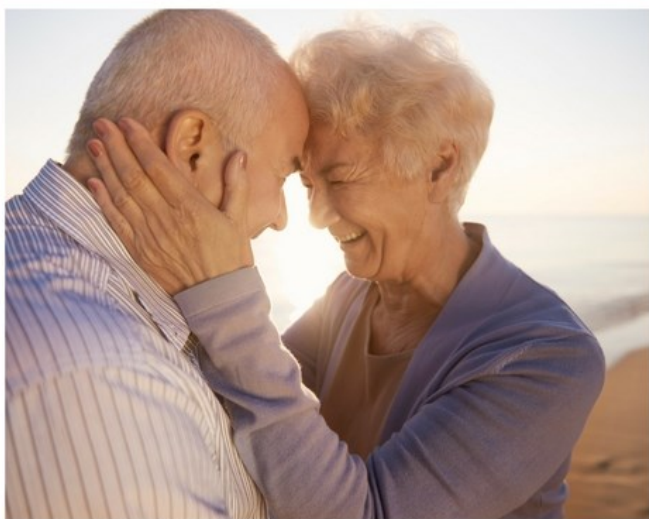
