We will have a new lighting board to manage our interior lights. Since the church was struck by lightening a number of years ago, our lights now are either all "on" or all "off". The upgrade will give us the ability to program the lighting for particular days and times of the year. It will be an enormous benefit to our liturgical celebrations. The works is scheduled to be completed at the end of August.

Hospitality and College Church Wedding Ministry

Hospitality is Biblical. It is not elective. Hospitality is one of our Christian virtues. As a parish, we are strong on hospitality! It is one of the reasons why my family and I chose to call College Church our faith home. The first time I walked into College Church, I knew immediately I was at home. My feelings are not unique. They are felt by thousands of students, parishioners and visitors who step inside. I am certain it is the Holy Spirit at work.



Every couple that I meet brings their own unique story and unique challenges. Last summer I had the occasion to have two weddings which required special circumstances. The first couple lived in Montana. The groom was in the Air Force. They were scheduled to be married in the winter of 2017. One spring afternoon I got a call from the bride. She was in tears. They had just found out that he would be deployed to Afghanistan in August. All of her plans came to a screeching halt. We spent an hour on the phone discussing the logistics of how she could move their wedding date up 6 months, but most importantly we talked about her fear. Her fear of the unknown, her fear for his safety, her fear of loneliness and her fear of how this would change them. Another one of our couples last summer found out that the bride's father had stage 4 cancer. They needed to move their wedding up so that her father would be able to walk his daughter down the aisle. I spent a lot of time on the phone speaking with the mother of the bride. I checked in with them weekly as we worked to change their details. When you are on the front lines in this ministry, it is a gift to be able to offer support, comfort, advice and an ear.

Over the past few years, we have looked critically at how we provide hospitality to our guests. First, we knew we needed a new bride's room. The brides had been assembling in an oversized coat closet next to the ballroom. So we renovated a room right off of the choir loft. It is a room containing stain glass windows from when the church was first built. The golden glow on a sunny day provides an amazing backdrop for pictures. Secondly, we increased our wedding ministry team by creating a role for a sacristan. We realized that we were missing out on an opportunity to really extend our hospitality at weddings. We recognized that by only having a wedding coordinator overseeing the rehearsals and weddings, we were overlooking the opportunity to be hospitable to people new to College Church. Finally, we streamlined the way that couples could book the Church. We digitized the process. We created a new website for College Church weddings and developed a system that allowed them to book online.

Getting married in the Catholic Church is serious business. Having one person on staff to focus solely on this busy ministry has allowed us to be welcoming and inviting to the couples from the moment they first make contact with us and to their family and guests who visit College Church for their wedding. The majority of couples who marry here are either young professionals or knee deep in graduate school. They need and appreciate someone who is easily accessible and quick to reply to their questions as they navigate this journey. I have heard many times how grateful they are for me returning their phone calls in a timely fashion, for explaining thoroughly what their marriage preparation would entail, and being present for them when they need support.

With College Church as a destination parish, many of the couples getting married here are either travelling in from out of state to marry at their alma mater or couples who have yet to find a home parish. College Church weddings have also become an important family tradition. In the last 2 years we have had the privilege of hosting weddings for 3 sisters (I jokingly told the mother of the brides that if she had anymore daughters we would have to give them a freebie). This fall, one of our couples is the third generation getting married here. Our desire is for couples to find themselves drawn to College Church and take into consideration joining us in calling SFX "home." But whether they decide to join our parish, or have their children baptized here we have successfully expanded the reach of our ministry.



While wedding ministry is a major revenue source for our church, it is a valuable and necessary ministry. We are accompanying people through a pivotal time in their lives, in their faith lives. It is easy to fall into the mindset that all the important ministries at College Church happen on Sundays. I encourage you to remember, in your prayers, the valuable ministry that we do at weddings on Saturdays.

LIGHTWORKS - AN EXPERIENCE OF IGNATIAN PRAYER

LIGHTWORKS is a “light form of work,” a series of limbering up exercises for the spirit. Physical exercises build muscle, increase stamina, and develop flexibility. So **LIGHTWORKS** does for the spirit. These exercises of prayer and reflection, build our relationship with God and help us become more aware of God’s presence in our lives. It consists of weekly group sessions. Participants are given scripture passages or reflections from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to pray over each week. These invite us into conversation with God about our lives. Then during the weekly session, there is sharing about these passages and a presentation. There are 16 weekly sessions with 8 before Thanksgiving and 8 in the new year. 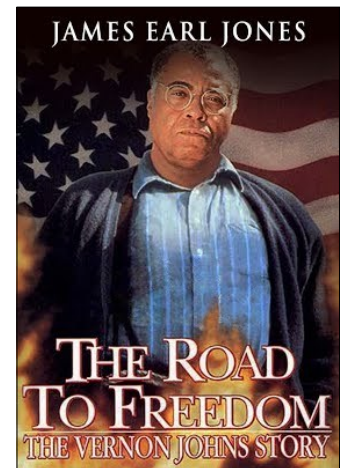
Film: *The Road to Freedom: The Vernon Johns Story*

Why Drink From the Cup?

From the early days of the Church the faithful were offered the Eucharist under the signs of bread and wine. In the middle ages reception of the cup fell into disuse for a variety of reasons for several centuries. Vatican II restored the fullness of the symbols of Body and Blood in encouraging the faithful to receive under both species.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 281, states: "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it is distributed under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clear expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord."

In today's first reading, Wisdom invites us, "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed", and at every Eucharist we hear Jesus say, "Take this all of you, and drink from it..." Drinking from the Eucharistic cup is essential to understanding the meaning of communion and of Jesus' sacrifice. We are called to both BE his Body in the world as well as imitate his own self-gift by pouring out our own lifeblood for the sake of others. The "Amen" we say as we receive the Body of Christ is our assent to becoming what we have eaten, the Body of Christ. Drinking the Blood of Christ makes us accountable to that amen and reminds us that we are called to live our Baptismal commitment on Jesus' terms.

Adult Atrium Sessions Come and see the Atrium!

We invite adults to come and experience this peaceful place, where our youngest members listen to God's Word, along with their catechists. Season of Creation

From September 1 to October 4 Christians around the globe will come together to pray and care for creation during what has been named the "Season of Creation". September 1 was proclaimed as a World Day of Prayer for Creation for the Orthodox in 1989. It was embraced by the major Christian European Churches in 2001 and by Pope Francis for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015, when he extended the World Day of Prayer to the "Season of Creation".

As Catholics we are accustomed to celebrating the various liturgical seasons throughout the Church year. The newly-proclaimed "Season of Creation", (although not an official liturgical season), offers us the chance to focus our attention on God the creator and to reflect on our human responsibility as creatures of Earth to serve and protect all of life. The timeframe precedes October 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron of ecology. This is a time for us to pray in gratitude to God for the gift of creation, to learn about integral ecology, and to take concrete actions to care for Earth.

The Ignatian Solidarity Network has created an Ecological Examen as a tool for prayer, reflection and action on behalf of our beloved Earth. On September 2 the parish Circle of Creation Committee will provide copies of this Examen at the church doors. We invite you to take this home and pray it to help us discern how we might become more committed to care for creation and those who are poor.

Bicentennial Lecture Series Continues September 24th With Ignatian Insights for 'Reimagining Health Care'

The Saint Louis University Bicentennial Lecture Series, "The Jesuit Influence in American Spirituality, Education and Society," continues with the Monday, September 24 presentation, "Reimagining Health Care: Ignatian Insights for Achieving the Greater Good." Michael Rozier, SJ, assistant professor of health management and policy at SLU will speak. The presentation will be held 7-8:30 p.m. at St. Francis Xavier College Church, Grand and Lindell boulevards. A light reception follows. Free parking is in the Laclede Garage, at Laclede Avenue and Grand Boulevard.



Rozier has a long history of working with communities of need, including the homeless, incarcerated, and refugees, both in the U.S. and in Latin America. A SLU alumnus, Rozier earned his doctorate in health management and policy at the University of Michigan. He also earned a graduate degree in international health systems from Johns Hopkins University. From 2008-11, Rozier taught global health and public health ethics at SLU and was the founding director of undergraduate education at SLU's School of Public Health.

The series closes on November 5 when Michael Garanzini, SJ, Secretary of Higher Education, Society of Jesus in Rome, *speaks on Jesuit Education: Do We Need a New Paradigm?*
