



# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



ope Francis spoke recently with young people and offered a striking image of Jesus Christ. Recalling Jesus' interactions with people, the Pope likened him to an "arsonist" who sets his disciple's hearts on fire. It is an arresting metaphor that reveals lesus in a way that disturbs and rings true at the same time. It reminded me of a lyric from one of my favorite singersongwriters, Jason Isbell. He sings, You thought God was an architect / but now you know, He's something like a pipe-bomb ready to go / and everything you built that's all for show, goes up in flames.

It is a very great temptation to domesticate God. We tend to want to limit, capture and contain God within our finite perspective. In some ways, we have to because it is the only way creatures can understand the Creator. We should be quite clear, though, that that is what we are doing. And we need to be even more clear God is never tamed.

The Holy Father and Mr. Isbell jar us from complacency. Coming from very different places, both show the danger to our carefully constructed illusions. The God of "fire" and "explosiveness" is not contained, despite our best efforts. An authentic encounter with the Living God is a dangerous thing because it leaves a person forever changed. Both seem to say, "Seek God, but you've been warned."

# **Outreach Program Updates**

Our twice weekly Documentation Assistance (Outreach) Program facilitates access to Missouri State IDs and birth certificates for low income individuals, Our guests need their identification for access to important resources and services, but experience logistical and financial barriers to obtaining those documents.

Here are some updates on who we served through our program from July 2016 - June 2017:

- ♦ Served a total of 3,441 guests, 55% Male, 45% Female
- ◆Assisted with 2,341 Missouri State ID cards
- ◆Assisted with 2,730 birth certificates, 970 of which were for children
- ♦ Provided 2,449 toiletry care kits and 2,659 bag lunches
- ♦83% of guests reported that they live in St. Louis City, vs. 17% in St. Louis County
- ♦46% of guests reported that they were currently experiencing homelessness
- ♦42% of guests reported that they were formerly incarcerated
- ◆The top reasons for needing an ID and/or birth certificate were (in order): Employment, Housing, Applying for Benefits, Health Needs, School, and Cashing Checks

Donut Sunday's will be the second Sunday of each month beginning in September. However, the October Donut Sunday will be on October I because of a conflict with the ballroom schedule.



From Most Reverend Robert J. Carlson, Archbishop of St. Louis

I know I speak for every person in the Archdiocese of St. Louis when I say how deeply saddened I am by the death and massive devastation our brothers and sisters in the South are experiencing in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey. # LIGHTWORKS AN EXPERIENCE OF IGNATION PRAYER



LIGHTWORKS is a "light form of work," a series of limbering up exercises for the spirit. Physical exercises build muscle, increase stamina, and develop flexibility. So LIGHT-WORKS does for the spirit. These exercises of prayer and reflection build our relationship with God and help us become more aware of God's presence in our lives. It consists of weekly group sessions. Participants are given

scripture passages or reflections from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to pray over each week. These invite us into conversation with God about our lives. Then during the weekly session, there is sharing about these passages and a presentation from one of the facilitators.
