## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The entire month of September has been designated by Pope Francis as the *Season of Creation*. It is a time to reflect upon our care for our common home, Earth. I think it fair to say the Catholic Church has come late to the realization stewardship of creation is an essential element of our faith. Other Christian denominations and faith traditions were earlier in making a connection, but better late than never!

There is no way to even scratch the surface of the issue's importance in a 250 word column. There is an abundance of material that addresses our care for creation from a faith perspective all over the internet and social media. A great place to start, of course, is the Pope's encyclical *Laudatio Si* which provides a summary of the science and what it means for Christians.

Perhaps most compelling for me personally is a very simple question, what kind of planet will we hand on to future generations? All of us care deeply about our kids, nieces, nephews and their children's children. Who among us feels good about the state of the natural world they will inherit? If sin always boils down to selfishness, it is clear our present relation with creation is sinful.

The *Season of Creation* asks us to integrate our faith and the gifts we have received. There is much to be done but perhaps nothing more important than realizing the unity that exists between our relationships with God, one another and all creation.

### Outreach Program Updates

Our twice weekly Documentation Assistance (Outreach) Program facilitates access to Missouri State IDs and birth certificates for low income individuals, Our guests need their identification for access to important resources and services, but experience logistical and financial barriers to obtaining those documents.

Here are some updates on who we served through our program from July 2016 - June 2017:

- ◆ Served a total of 3,441 guests, 55% Male, 45% Female
- ◆ Assisted with 2,341 Missouri State ID cards
- ◆ Assisted with 2,730 birth certificates, 970 of which were for children
- ◆ Provided 2,449 toiletry care kits and 2,659 bag lunches
- ◆ 83% of guests reported that they live in St. Louis City, vs. 17% in St. Louis County
- ◆ 46% of guests reported that they were currently experiencing homelessness
- ◆ 42% of guests reported that they were formerly incarcerated
- ◆ The top reasons for needing an ID and/or birth certificate were (in order): Employment, Housing, Applying for Benefits, Health Needs, School, and Cashing Checks

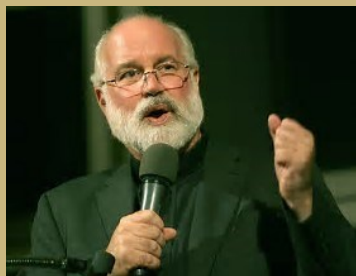
### MERCY HOSPITAL BIRTHING CENTER

**AN EXPERIENCE OF IGNATIAN PRAYER**



**LIGHTWORKS** is a “light form of work,” a series of limbering up exercises for the spirit. Physical exercises build muscle, increase stamina, and develop flexibility. So **LIGHTWORKS** does for the spirit. These exercises of prayer and reflection build our relationship with God and help us become more aware of God’s presence in our lives. It consists of weekly group sessions. Participants are given scripture passages or reflections from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to pray over each week. **BLESSED STANLEY ROTHER**

Fr. Stanley Rother, a priest from Oklahoma, volunteered to serve in the diocesan mission in Guatemala. He learned the Mayan dialect and won the trust of the community. When resentment against social injustice turned to resistance, government repression developed. His name appeared on one of the death lists and he returned to Oklahoma but found it unbearable to be away from the people. He returned to Guatemala. On July 28, 1981, gunmen tried to kidnap him. When he resisted, he was shot.
