Walking in Hope: A Celebration of Saint Oscar Romero October 7-14, 2018

On October 14, Oscar Romero, former archbishop of El Salvador, will be canonized. He was murdered while saying mass because he advocated for the poor and oppressed. Leading up to the canonization, College Church, Campus Ministry at St.



Louis University and other organizations will be hosting presentations on his life, his work and on the issues oppression and immigration that the faith community still faces today. The week will begin at College Church with a presentation by Fr. Tim McMahon, SJ, former provincial of the Jesuits at 9:15 on Sunday, October 7 in the ball room, entitled "Oscar Romero: Archbishop with an Attitude".


