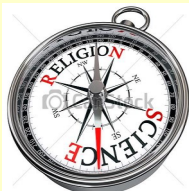

Invitation to the Parish!

What is the one thing everyone here at St. Francis Xavier (College) Church does? We pray together! Our shared prayer is what unites us no matter what mass we attend, or our participation in various ministries. Gathering in prayer is the foundation of who we are. So what can we do to make our shared prayer extend beyond the Sunday liturgy?

I am glad you asked. I invite all of us, as one faith community, to dedicate ourselves in 2017 to praying daily the Daily Examen of St. Ignatius Loyola. Below you will find information about what this is and how to do it. More than anything else, I believe this simple yet rich form of prayer is a structured way of paying attention. St. Ignatius believed God desires to be known and is present to us in every instant. The question is, do we notice?

Consider this a spiritual New Year's Resolution, and a fitting way to celebrate our on-going 175th anniversary. I know there are some who have been praying the Examen for many years and others for whom this is brand new. No matter. It is my fervent belief that dedicating ourselves to this prayer will have an enormous impact on our individual and communal spiritual life.

Examen of Consciousness

The Examen prayer is a unique part of Ignatian Spirituality. Ignatius presents it early in the Spiritual Exercises so that individuals may come to recognize God's presence in their lives and God's invitations to discipleship and wholeness. Ignatius fundamentally believed that God is present and at work in the world and in each person's life. During his recovery from a broken leg, Ignatius became aware of the movements toward life and those that drained life as he reflected on his experiences and ideas. If we are going to recognize God's presence and action in our lives, it is important to take time reflect upon what is going on and ask God to help us see our lives as God sees them. The Examen is one way to do consciously reflect upon and savor our lives.



The Examen may take different forms. The focus could be thanksgiving for and appreciation of one's blessings and opportunities. Fr. James Martin SJ writes that "For Ignatius many things--no matter how seemingly inconsequential--are occasions for gratitude." A moment of appreciation of nature, a call from a friend or insight gained in a conversation may be a moment to recognize God in our life. Another focus could be our relationships within family, workplace or community. The Examen can focus on the positive parts of life or those that need to change.

There are five steps to the Examen prayer:

1. Place yourself in God's presence. Give thanks for God's great love for you.
2. Pray for the grace to understand how God is acting in your life.
3. Review your day — recall specific moments and your feelings at the time.
4. Reflect on what you did, said, or thought in those instances. Were you drawing closer to God, or further away?
5. Look toward tomorrow — think of how you might collaborate more effectively with God's plan. Be specific, and conclude with the "Our Father."

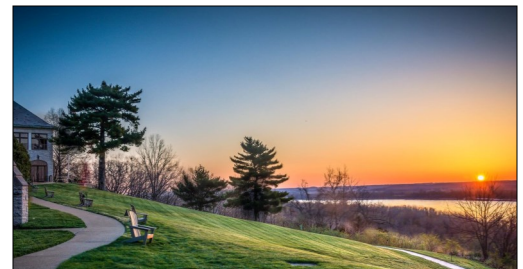

College Church parishioners have already been involved in a number of MCU efforts, including their "Break the Pipeline" campaign, focused on breaking the "school to prison pipeline" in the St. Louis area, as well as phone banking to oppose Amendment 6 during the election season. Membership in MCU entails paying annual dues, budgeted through Social Ministry, as well as investing time and talent into the group. Through membership, congregations have access to professionally trained community organizers, leadership training, relationships with other faith and value based institutions, and engagement in powerful efforts to achieve justice.
