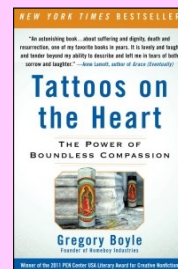

More than anything else, I believe this simple yet rich form of prayer is a structured way of paying attention. Consider this a fitting way to celebrate our on-going 175th anniversary.



The Examen prayer is a unique part of Ignatian Spirituality. There are five steps to the Examen prayer:

1. Place yourself in God's presence. Give thanks for God's great love for you.
2. Pray for the grace to understand how God is acting in your life.
3. Review your day — recall specific moments and your feelings at the time.
4. Reflect on what you did, said, or thought in those instances. Were you drawing closer to God, or further away?
5. Look toward tomorrow — think of how you might collaborate more effectively with God's plan. Be specific, and conclude with the "Our Father."

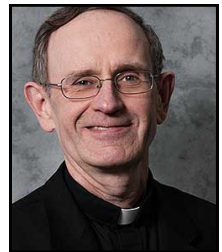

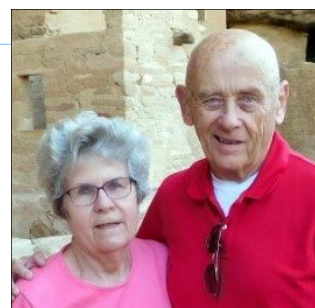

The largest bell, called the "big barytone", was hit by grapeshot in its belfry in Cadiz in 1812 when Wellington and Napoleon were battling. It was blown to pieces, melted and recast.

There were originally four bells but one disappeared from the St. Louis riverfront where they were stored between 1839 and 1843 when the Jesuits purchased them at an auction. The last bell is believed to be somewhere in the United States. A mystery to solve!!!!

Breaking the School Prison Pipeline with MCU

The "School to Prison Pipeline" refers to the fact that children of color and children experiencing poverty are more likely to receive out of school suspensions and other harsh disciplinary practices beginning as early as kindergarten, leading to early contact with the justice system and an increased likelihood of incarceration later in life. Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU)'s "Break the Pipeline" campaign seeks to break this school to prison pipeline in our local region, and they are already making an impact. 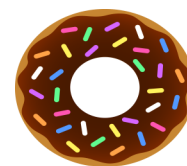


- The curb cut in front of the church on Grand Avenue is for **drop off only**.
