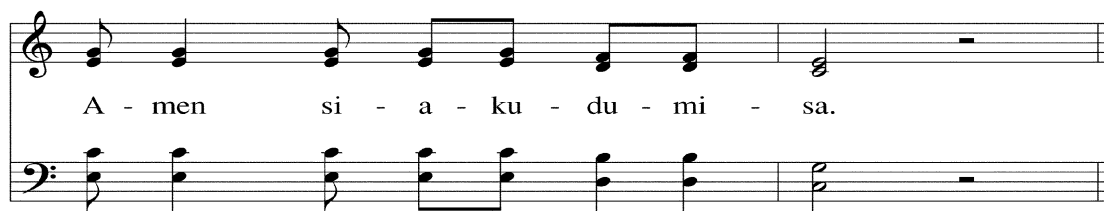

From the Pastor's Desk



Do you remember the best teacher you ever had? What made him or her so good? I think there are three key elements to an outstanding teacher. The first is having an excellent grasp of the subject matter. You can't teach what you don't know. Secondly, great teachers convey that knowledge to students so they too become enthused about the subject. Their students want to know more. Finally, the best teachers teach by their example. Their lives reflect who they claim to be.

This liturgical year we have an extended period to hear much of St. Matthew's version of the Sermon on the Mount. This is one of the longest addresses by Jesus in any of the Gospels. Matthew depicts Him as an instructor in God's ways. He teaches, encourages, and forms those listening to his words. His words are rooted in his understanding of who God is. The crowd of listeners is invited, even commanded, to share in Jesus' vision. And perhaps most important, Jesus incarnates his teaching. He is teaching himself, and revealing God through who he is. There is no distinction between the message and messenger. They are one and the same.

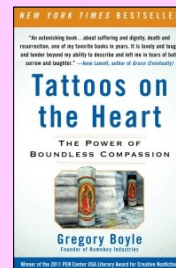


Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

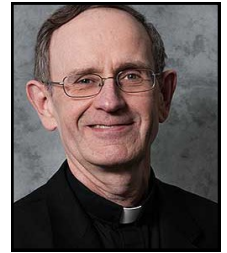

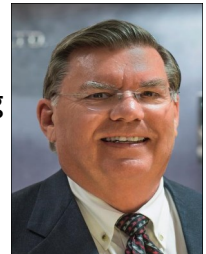

Breaking the School Prison Pipeline with MCU TODAY, February 19 in the SFX Ballroom after the 10:30 am Mass

The "School to Prison Pipeline" refers to the fact that children of color and children experiencing poverty are more likely to receive out of school suspensions and other harsh disciplinary practices beginning as early as kindergarten, leading to early contact with the justice system and an increased likelihood of incarceration later in life. Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU)'s "Break the Pipeline" campaign seeks to break this school to prison pipeline in our local region, and they are already making an impact. 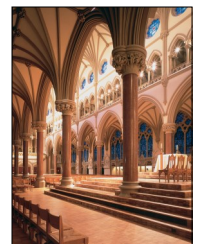
Christian Life Communities for SLU Graduate Students, Faculty, and Staff Forming for Spring Semester
