Lenten Gathering Rite

Lent invites us to pause and ponder the quality of our relationship with God and others...to celebrate the good we find there and to seek forgiveness and reconciliation for what is lacking. The traditional Lenten disciplines – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – provide us the contours and practices for the conversion we seek.

During this penitential season the Gathering Rite we will sing gently implores, “Gather us in mercy, Lord. From the depths we cry to you.” Then the presider will invite us, the assembly, to either kneel or bow our heads during the penitential rite. Either posture is a way of helping us bodily recognize and acknowledge our need for God’s mercy. Doing this together further underlines the communal nature of our Lenten journey of conversion and of our need for one another. Our bodies, our voices, our hearts unite in humility and trust as we enter into the great prayer of the mass.

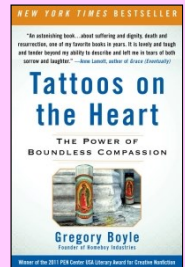

Lenten Directives

Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self, take up his cross each day and follow in my steps." (Lk 9:23)



The Church has consistently helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing penitential practices for all Catholics. The American Bishops have called us to fast and abstinence during Lent.

Fasting is a sign of our complete dependence upon God. God is the source of our life; fasting helps us show our reliance upon God rather than food and ourselves. Ash Wednesday (March 1) and Good Friday (April 14) are days of fasting for those from the ages of 18-59. Fasting means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). Our common fasting manifests our collective commitment to place God first in our lives.

Abstinence from meat invites us to join the poor of the world in eating simply. As Jesus emptied himself and shared in the poverty of the human condition, we are asked to embrace the poverty of those who have only subsistence diets. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All who are 14 years of age and older, unless there is a serious health problem, asked to share in this discipline.

In addition to these shared practices, everyone is encouraged to find ways during Lent to draw closer to God through prayer and spiritual practices. Consider embracing the daily practice of praying the Examen as a way to deepen your relationship with God.

Anointing of the Sick

Healing was one of the central aspects of the ministry of Jesus. He was moved with care and compassion for each of the people who sought his assistance. The universal church continues this ministry of healing, and invites all of us to be mindful of those who are sick .

At each of our parish masses this weekend, 5:15 pm, 8:00 am, and 10:30 am, we will have the Anointing of the Sick. All who have a serious illness or who are weakened through advancing age are encouraged to receive the sacrament.

Our community celebration of anointing allows us to focus our prayer for them, express our support, and affirm their dignity as our sisters and brothers in Christ. As we pray for them today, reach out to them with your prayer, a smile, a word of support, or by touching their shoulder or holding their hand as we pray for them.

While the community prays for them, they remain seated. Then those who are able, are invited to step out into the aisle and a priest will come to you and anoint you. Those who are not able to stand, are asked to raise their hand as the priest approaches them. He will come to you and anoint your forehead and the palms of your hands with the words:

*Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
May the Lord who frees you from sin, save you and raise you up. Amen*

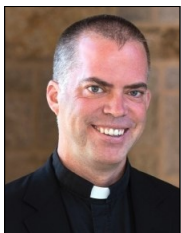
