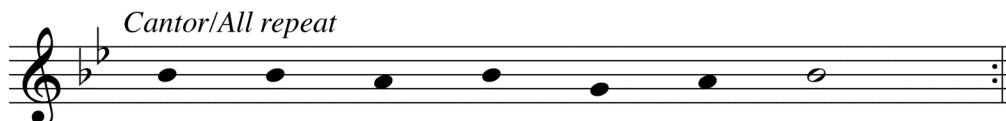

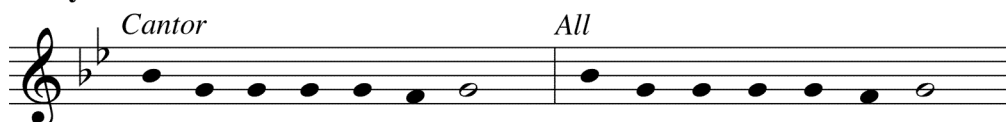

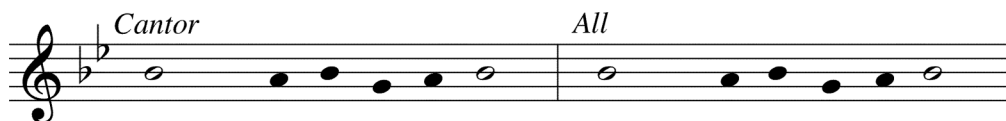

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Lenten Gathering Rite

Lent invites us to pause and ponder the quality of our relationship with God and others...to celebrate the good we find there and to seek forgiveness and reconciliation for what is lacking. The traditional Lenten disciplines – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – provide us the contours and practices for the conversion we seek.

During this penitential season the Gathering Rite we will sing gently implores, “Gather us in mercy, Lord. From the depths we cry to you.” Then the presider will invite the assembly to either kneel or bow our heads during the penitential rite. Either posture is a way of helping us bodily recognize and acknowledge our need for God’s mercy. Doing this together further underlines the communal nature of our Lenten journey of conversion and of our need for one another. Our bodies, our voices, our hearts unite in humility and trust as we enter into the great prayer of the mass.

Strategic Plan Goal #3 is “To Foster Lifelong Faith Formation Rooted in Gospel Values and Ignatian Spirituality”

The Adult Faith Formation Commission helps to realize this very important goal by coordinating and promoting high quality experiences to inform and inspire our faith throughout our lives. From the Pastor's Desk



The Gospels for the next Sundays of Lent are some of the most important in our tradition: the Samaritan woman at the well, the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. All are from John's Gospel. The practice of proclaiming these particular stories goes back to the golden age of the catechuminate in the Early Church. As early as the 5th century they were the Gospels for the latter half of the Lenten season.

It would be foolish to try to summarize these magnificent stories. There is incredible depth and complexity to each one. St. John's mastery as an author is indicated in these texts. They do share, however, a sense of spiritual movement. The three Gospel stories start from an encounter with Jesus that moves the participants into deeper understanding of who he is. An extended dialogue with him leads to an ultimate expression of their faith in the Lord.

The long weeks of Lent remind us our faith journey takes time. Christ constantly inviting us into a deeper understanding. Like the people in the stories there is not usually a single, defining moment when we "get it". Rather, we remain in a on-going dialogue with Jesus. He is inviting us constantly to grow in our love.

Take Action!

An integral piece of Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU)'s "Break the Pipeline" campaign involves engaging people of faith in legislative action that works toward breaking the school to prison pipeline. Here are two pieces of Missouri legislation that need your support:

SUPPORT Senate Bill 40 (Raise the Age): This bill would raise the age of juvenile court jurisdiction in Missouri from 17 to 18 years of age and prohibit the detention of anyone below the age of 18 in an adult jail, unless certified as an adult. The bills would also raise the age that a youth can be certified and transferred to the adult system except for the most serious offenses.

SUPPORT Senate Bill 287 (Police Bias Reform): This bill creates a process for reducing bias in policing by requiring police officers to report details for each person they stop, to be compiled, published, and analyzed for bias.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd



Right under our noses is an approach to the religious formation of children known as

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd was begun by a scripture scholar and a Montessori guide more than 60 years ago in Rome and has expanded to 6 continents, 40+ countries, and countless communities of different cultures and economic status.

What gives this approach its longevity may just be what makes it so unusual. CGS begins with the idea that children are already in relationship with God.

What is needed for this relationship to flourish is not to teach them everything we know or to tell them our experiences, but to find out what they need. What face of God is most meaningful to the child at this stage of development? What scripture do they want to hear again, and again? What fills the child with joy? After many years of observation, themes developed. The themes that were found to appeal most to the youngest children were the core themes of the faith. This work happens in a space called the Atrium, named after the place the catechumens were prepared to enter the church. A place of work, study and prayer. A place where the child can choose what to work with according to his or her own needs. Montessori based spiritual formation with short presentations and long periods for the child's individual work.



Here at College Church, we are fortunate to have CGS. The respect all of us in RE have for the children in our care, not only must we protect them, we must also listen to them. We must come to know them as part of the church, not in a future sense, but as they are right now.—Susan Reese, Coordinator of CGS at College Church

“After assisting in the Atrium, I came to realize it contains the roots of what attracts me to the College Church. The Montessori approach is quiet and very respectful of the child, which brings about respect for others (Social Ministry) and of our time together (Liturgy). Sometimes as I watch a 4-year old engrossed in the Last Supper “work”, for example, I see Ignatian Gospel Contemplation!” Mary Nagel
