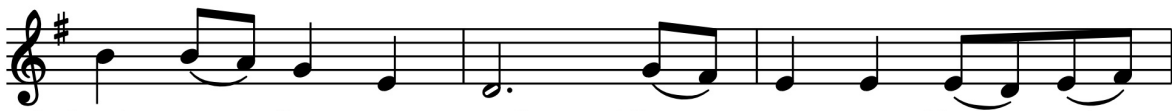

Lenten Gathering Rite

Lent invites us to pause and ponder the quality of our relationship with God and others...to celebrate the good we find there and to seek forgiveness and reconciliation for what is lacking. The traditional Lenten disciplines – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – provide us the contours and practices for the conversion we seek.

During this penitential season the Gathering Rite we will sing gently implores, “Gather us in mercy, Lord. From the depths we cry to you.” Then the presider will invite the assembly to either kneel or bow our heads during the penitential rite. Either posture is a way of helping us bodily recognize and acknowledge our need for God’s mercy. Doing this together further underlines the communal nature of our Lenten journey of conversion and of our need for one another. Our bodies, our voices, our hearts unite in humility and trust as we enter into the great prayer of the mass.

From The Pastor's Desk



Language shapes our faith. Take for instance how various languages refer to our current liturgical season of prayer, fasting and penance that prepares us for Easter. This season in Latin is *Quadragesima*, “the forty (days)”. The various romance languages are similar in simply referring to forty days. The Spanish, for instance, is *Cuaresma*.

English is different. We call this time Lent from the Old English word *lencten*, meaning “spring”. *Lencten* is also the root for the English word “lengthen”. For English-speakers, the name for this liturgical season stresses not the number of days but how they are growing longer. The light of the sun that each day increases in length points to the Resurrection of Christ, the light of the world.

Lent is a delightful reminder of the intimate connection of our liturgical calendar with the natural world. The Church year grew out of the seasons of the northern hemisphere: the cold, dark nights of winter give way as daylight grows longer. The increased sun brings new life as plants and flowers re-emerge after lying dormant for months. Nature itself is symbolic of Christ's death and resurrection.

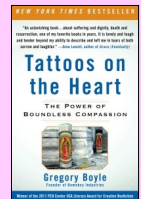
This year we have been hit with the double-whammy of Lent starting late and no real winter to speak of. Trees and plants are already blooming so the natural world is running ahead of us. Nothing wrong with that as even in this season we remain an Easter people.

Take Action!

An integral piece of Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU)'s "Break the Pipeline" campaign involves engaging people of faith in legislative action that works toward breaking the school to prison pipeline. Here are two pieces of Missouri legislation that need your support:

SUPPORT Senate Bill 40 (Raise the Age): This bill would raise the age of juvenile court jurisdiction in Missouri from 17 to 18 years of age and prohibit the detention of anyone below the age of 18 in an adult jail, unless certified as an adult. The bills would also raise the age that a youth can be certified and transferred to the adult system except for the most serious offenses.

SUPPORT Senate Bill 287 (Police Bias Reform): This bill creates a process for reducing bias in policing by requiring police officers to report details for each person they stop, to be compiled, published, and analyzed for bias.

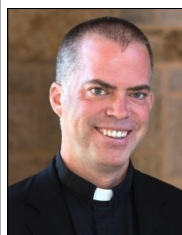
