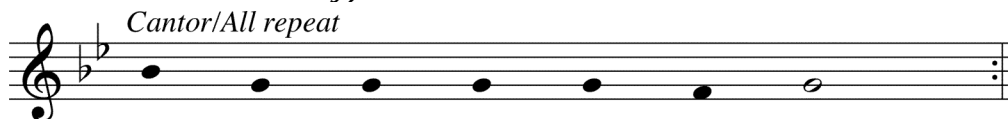

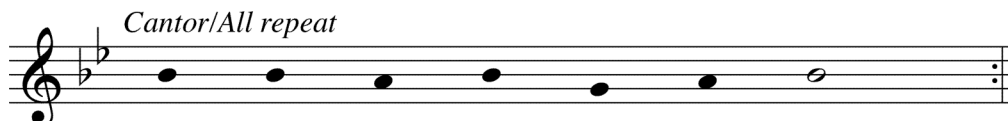

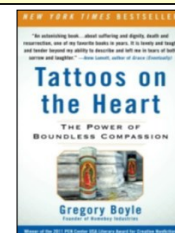
The Go St. Louis Marathon will not impact parking for the College Church on Palm Sunday, but it will impact how you can get here.

## From the Pastor's Desk



Today we have a beloved Gospel story, the raising of Lazarus. As wonderful as it is, please do not neglect our first reading from the prophet Ezekiel. Let me say right off that this book is one of strangest and most difficult in the Scriptures. There is wild imagery, striking metaphors, and downright bizarre behavior. Some Jewish traditions recommended only reading the text when a person had reached the age of thirty.

This is why it is best to experience it liturgically. Taking Ezekiel in bite-sized chunks really helps understand his message. The prophet wrote in perhaps the worst period for the people of Israel. The temple is destroyed, the country in ruins, and Ezekiel himself is part of the exiled community in Babylon.

Yet the message of today's section is that of hope. The restoration of the people and return to the land of Israel is the message. Notice this is the work of God not the people. There are only three verses but notice who is doing what: "I will open your graves", "I will put my spirit in you", "I will settle you on the land", "I have promised and I will do it". This is what God does with utter gratuity. It is not earned or won, but comes from the goodness of God. Our God labors for us because God loves us.

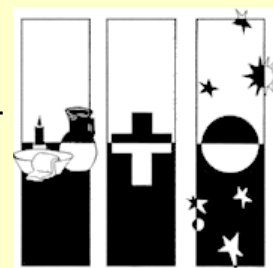
### Save The Date—Next Saturday, April 8th 175th Anniversary Fun Run

## The Sacred Triduum



The observance of the season of Lent ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, when the **Triduum** begins – the three days which are truly the high holy days of the Church's liturgical year. If Christmas is a season of light, the **Triduum is one of love**. In these three days we commemorate the events which marked the defining moments of Jesus' life – his last meal with his apostles, his crucifixion and death, and then his resurrection into eternal life. Each event represents the gracious out-poured love of God for each one of us...a love that is extravagant and boundless.

The rituals of these days form one continuous liturgy. We begin with the Eucharistic celebration on Holy Thursday, in which we have the Mandatum, the washing of the feet which represents the kind of love to which all of us are called. It concludes with a transfer of the Eucharist to its place of repose. On Friday the liturgy continues with a simple entrance of the priest, the proclamation of the Passion and the veneration of the cross, reception of Communion, and again a quiet ending; then finally, the crescendo of the three days, the celebration of the great Easter Vigil, the climax of the entire church year. On Friday and Holy Saturday we are urged to observe what is called the Paschal Fast, a fast focused on the anticipation of the joys of the resurrection, done in union with the Elect throughout the world who will be immersed in the waters of rebirth at the Vigil.

The days are replete with lavish use of symbols – bread and wine, washing of feet, touching of the cross, water, oil and light, flowers and bells, beautiful music...an excessive display to help us realize the lavishness of God's love!

**All are welcome and encouraged to enter prayerfully into the rich Liturgy of these days.** The schedule is as follows:

### Opportunity for Service—Linen Keepers

College Church has a small but dedicated group of generous women who serve the liturgy by caring for the corporals and purificators that are used regularly for our masses. Two of our five ladies will be retiring from this ministry in April, so we are in need of a few additional people who would be willing to take this on.
