## **Easter Season Sprinkling Rite**

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) encourages the use of a sprinkling rite during the Sundays of the Easter season. As a Church we weekly renew our own baptismal promises, recalling that it was through the waters of baptism that we became members of Christ's Body and were incorporated into his risen life. So when we are sprinkled each Sunday, let us exult in the new life we have been given through the abundance of God's grace!

### From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday we celebrate First Communion at the 10:30 liturgy. Welcome to family and friends who have come to be part of this joyful celebration of Christ's presence among us. I am grateful for our religious education instructors for their generous ministry to prepare our children to receive the Eucharist.



It is a happy coincidence of the Easter season that First Communion occurs on the Sunday when we hear the story of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is one of the most beautiful and joyful episodes from St. Luke's Gospel. Perhaps my favorite part is when the two and Jesus (though they don't know it is him!) arrive at the village. The Risen Lord seems to want to keep going but they beg him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day almost over."

Cleopas and his friend do not yet fully know who it is they are traveling with but they want him to remain. Our sharing in Christ's Body and Blood is the expression of his desire to stay with us. All of us, young and old, desire for Jesus to stay with us. We need him to remain with our families, friends and community. The good news is, just like the two followers on the way, he always does.

## The Offertory Procession: What Is It That We Bring To the Altar?

What is it that we bring to the altar? In preparation for First Communion this year, we have spent significant time with the children reflecting on this question. The "simple" answer is bread and wine. And yet, when we begin to ponder the bread and wine the richness of these gifts unfolds.

One of the insights that we have come to this year in our preparation is that all of creation is a gift from God to us, but that creation is not finished yet. It is a part of God's plan that the human beings have a special role in the on-going work of creation, in the transformation of creation. By the work of our hands, we take the gift of wheat and make bread; we take grapes and make wine. Our work brings the creation of the earth to a new place. It represents all the gifts that we've received from God that we transform "by the work of our hands" - our cooking, our cleaning, our drawing, our skating, our playing sports, our befriending, our reading, our studying, our loving. We present our whole lives to God at the altar and ask God to transform them, to fill them--that God's presence may shine through them.

As part of today's celebration, the children who are making their First Communion will bring up in the Presentation of the Gifts symbols of the "work of their hands." They will lay them at the foot of the altar as a visible image of what the offering of the bread and wine represent to them: the offering of their daily lives on behalf of God's gifts.




