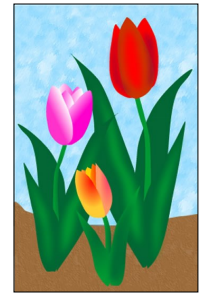

From the Pastor's Desk



The Third Week of St. Ignatius Loyola's *Spiritual Exercises* is focused on Christ's Passion. Retreatants are to pray over the events from the entry into Jerusalem until His death on the cross. Ignatius instructs the person to seek the grace of "confusion" as he or she accompanies Jesus.

That is a most appropriate response to the events of Holy Week. Confusion results from expecting or believing something with certainty, and suddenly being confronted with what was inconceivable. It is the feeling of bewilderment when one senses everything has been turned up-side down. Clearly the followers of Jesus did not expect the fervent crowds chanting "Hosanna" would soon be screaming "Crucify him!" Triumph is replaced quickly by seeming defeat. It is no wonder that in there shock and confusion, Jesus' disciples flee and Peter even denies Him. The Passion's disorientating experience challenges all we think we know. The finality is perhaps most confusing of all. Hopes are dashed and all is lost.

It is not the end, of course. What appears to be ultimate destruction is the beginning of new life. There is value, though, in allowing this grace of confusion to touch our hearts. The disappointment, loss and feeling of abandonment is real. Christ's suffering and death cannot be glossed over. These most important days require us to choose to remain close to Him. Watch and pray.

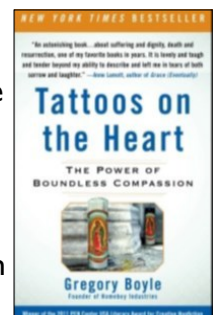

Children's Liturgy of the Word will not be available on Easter Sunday, April 16th.

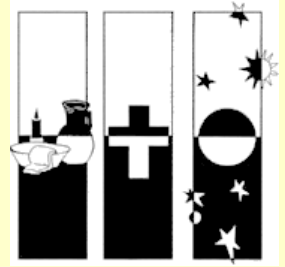
Lenten Reading Celebration

The Sacred Triduum



The observance of the season of Lent ends with the Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday, when the **Triduum** begins – the three days which are truly the high holy days of the Church’s liturgical year. If Christmas is a season of light, the **Triduum is one of love**. In these three days we commemorate the events which marked the defining moments of Jesus’ life – his last meal with his apostles, his crucifixion and death, and then his resurrection into eternal life. Each event represents the gracious outpoured love of God for each one of us...a love that is extravagant and boundless.

The rituals of these days form one continuous liturgy. We begin with the Eucharistic celebration on Holy Thursday, in which we have the Mandatum, the washing of the feet which represents the kind of love to which all of us are called. It concludes with a transfer of the Eucharist to its place of repose. On Friday the liturgy continues with a simple entrance of the priest, the proclamation of the Passion and the veneration of the cross, reception of Communion, and again a quiet ending; then finally, the crescendo of the three days, the celebration of the great Easter Vigil, the climax of the entire church year. On Friday and Holy Saturday we are urged to observe what is called the Paschal Fast, a fast focused on the anticipation of the joys of the resurrection, done in union with the Elect throughout the world who will be immersed in the waters of rebirth at the Vigil.

The days are replete with lavish use of symbols – bread and wine, washing of feet, touching of the cross, water, oil and light, flowers and bells, beautiful music...an excessive display to help us realize the lavishness of God’s love!

All are welcome and encouraged to enter prayerfully into the rich Liturgy of these days. The schedule is as follows:

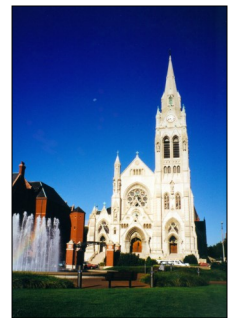
