From the Pastor's Desk

The first reading throughout the Easter season is from the Acts of the Apostles. It is a unique creation because it is the companion piece to the Gospel of Luke. St. Luke wrote the Gospel and Acts as a single, two-part work. He is the only Evangelist to do so. This also makes him the source of more New Testament material than any other author, including St. Paul.



St. Luke shows the story of Jesus Christ cannot be told without the story of the beginnings of His Church. Acts of the Apostles reveals the earliest days of the Christian community. This is not so much a strict history but a faith narrative focused on theological and pastoral teaching rather than a consideration of people and events. It is salvation history that stresses the workings of the Holy Spirit in the first believers. The expansion of the Christian community, with accompanying graces and struggles, is the content of the narrative.

I find it appealing to see ourselves as the latest chapter in Luke's story. Imagine our 175 years as a faith community being an on-going manifestation of the Spirit's work. Our own "Acts" have reflected the particular time and place where the Good News has been proclaimed. Like our ancestors in faith, we give thanks for what has been accomplished and seek God's help for whatever is to come.

Easter Season Sprinkling Rite

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) encourages the use of a sprinkling rite during the Sundays of the Easter season. As a Church we weekly renew our own baptismal promises, recalling that it was through the waters of baptism that we became members of Christ's Body and were incorporated into his risen life. So when we are sprinkled each Sunday, let us exult in the new life we have been given through the abundance of God's grace!

Pentecost Readers Needed!

One of the significant things that occurred when the Spirit came upon the apostles 2000 years ago was that people of all languages could understand one another. From the diversity of peoples gathered in Jerusalem the Spirit created a sense of unity, of oneness. To acknowledge both the rich diversity of cultures here, and the unity we share as brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ, we would like to have parishioners who speak a second language to read the intercessions at the 5:15 and 10:30 masses on Pentecost Sunday, June 3-4. Volunteers will be given an intercession to translate, then will read it from the ambo first in their second language and then in English. Fr. Richard begins this meditation by urging us to consider what we may have seen had any of us been present at the moment of the resurrection of Jesus. In his meditation, he suggests that most probably we would have seen nothing but a blinding flash of light as the Christ energy came into its fullness in His resurrection,

This year's Paschal candle is meant to reflect this imagery as the resurrected one rises in light and love over the darkness of pain and death, the light penetrating even the torture devices we humans can inflict on one another. 
