



The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) encourages the use of a sprinkling rite during the Sundays of the Easter season. As a Church we weekly renew our own baptismal promises, recalling that it was through the waters of baptism that we became members of Christ's Body and were incorporated into his risen life. So when we are sprinkled each Sunday, let us exult in the new life we have been given through the abundance of God's grace!

They made a vow to have a silver crown made for her if the students and Fathers continued to be spared. Throughout the plague not a single student, professor or Jesuit Father fell ill, and students made good on their promise. When the epidemic was over, the students had a silver crown made in gratitude. Father Peter DeSmet, S.J. was present at the ceremony in which the crown was placed on the statue of the Virgin Mary.

During this Anniversary year we honor Mary again. We celebrate Mary's unceasing presence and protection to the College Church community throughout these 175 years.
