This Tuesday August 15th is the feast of the Assumption. The 7:15 am liturgy will be as normal in the chapel. The noon and 5:15 pm will be in the church.

From the Pastor's Desk



Tuesday is the feast of the Assumption. It celebrates our belief that Mary's body was "assumed" into heaven at the end of her life. Surprisingly, though this tradition dates back at least to the 5th century, it was only formally approved as a doctrine of the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII in 1950. One can never accuse the Church of doing anything in haste.

There is incredible depth to the tradition and teaching of Mary's Assumption. I want to highlight one aspect that strikes me in particular. The Apostle's Creed states we believe in "the resurrection of the body." Our faith tells us human beings are body and soul, physical and spiritual beings. Because that is who we are, we cannot share in the resurrection as merely dis-embodied spirits. Our bodies are essential. Now what exactly a resurrected body looks like is well beyond my pay-grade.

We also believe Mary was the first and foremost of believers. She said yes to God's Word and bore Christ. She is the model for all the faithful. It is fitting, therefore, that she is first to share in the fruits of His resurrection. God's favor to Mary is the same hope we have for ourselves. The Feast of the Assumption of Mary reminds us of our sharing in Christ's life forever.

The Duchesne Mass

In 1818, Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne and four companions arrived in the New World to make God's love known through their service of education. Thanks to these intrepid missionaries, the Religious of the Sacred Heart are now in 41 countries with a network of 147 schools. To celebrate the bicentennial of Philippine's arrival, we have commissioned Father Michael Joncas to compose the Duchesne Mass, asking that it might echo early American music.

The formal premiere of the Mass will be at the Cathedral Basilica on November 18, 2018, but in preparation for that event, the College Church community will learn the Mass this fall, beginning next weekend, and we will welcome the composer on the weekend of October 29th for a professional recording. We are so grateful for this collaboration with all of you and hope that this musical setting will be a grace for us all.

LIGHTWORKS – AN EXPERIENCE OF IGNATIAN PRAYER

LIGHTWORKS is a “light form of work,” a series of limbering up exercises for the spirit. Physical exercises build muscle, increase stamina, and develop flexibility. So **LIGHTWORKS** does for the spirit. These exercises of prayer and reflection, build our relationship with God and help us become more aware of God’s presence in our lives. It consists of weekly group sessions. Participants are given scripture passages or reflections from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to pray over each week. These invite us into conversation with God about our lives. Then during the weekly session, there is sharing about these passages and a presentation from one of the facilitators. There are 15 weekly sessions with 7 before Thanksgiving and 8 in the new year. LightWorks will be offered at College Church this fall on Sundays from noon until 2:00 pm, beginning on October 1.

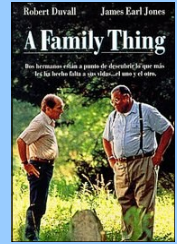
