FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



he movie Hidden Figures tells the story of African-American women mathematicians and physicists whose calculations were a key to the success of the U.S. space program. When the film finished my first reaction was, why have I never heard this story? It was a powerful reminder that history is story we choose to tell, and there is often a great deal left out in the telling.

Christians believe in salvation history. That is how God has been at work in the world in and through God's people. The whole of the Scriptures and tradition is salvation history. St. Luke offers a great example. He wrote his Gospel but also the Acts of the Apostles to demonstrate the story of Jesus is also the story of the Church. Christian faith is lived out in a particular time, place, and people.

We can exclude or ignore parts of our salvation history, too. This Saturday, September 9, learn some of our "hidden" salvation history. The north city deanery is sponsoring *Cloud of Witnesses: Past and Present*. The pilgrimage will focus on significant elements of the struggle for racial justice right in our neighborhood. It will be a chance to not only know what has been, but also the important work happening right now. It will be a wonderful way for many different people to come together to learn more of our story, and be inspired to write the next chapter.

The Duchesne Mass

In 1818, Saint Philippine Duchesne and four companions arrived in the New World to make God's love known through their service of education. Thanks to these intrepid missionaries, the Religious of the Sacred Heart are now in 41 countries with a network of 147 schools. To celebrate the bicentennial of Philippine's arrival, Father Michael Joncas has been commissioned to compose the Duchesne Mass, asking that it might echo early American music.

The premiere of the Mass will be at the Cathedral Basilica on Nov. 18, 2018, but in preparation for that event, the College Church community will learn the Mass this fall, and we will welcome the composer on the weekend of Oct. 29 for a professional recording. We are grateful for this collaboration with all of you and hope that this musical setting will be a grace for us all.

Outreach Program Updates

Our twice weekly Documentation Assistance (Outreach) Program facilitates access to Missouri State IDs and birth certificates for low income individuals, Our guests need their identification for access to important resources and services, but experience logistical and financial barriers to obtaining those documents.

Here are some updates on who we served through our program from July 2016-June 2017:

- ◆Served a total of 3,441 guests, 55% Male, 45% Female
- ◆Assisted with 2,341 Missouri State ID cards
- ♦ Assisted with 2,730 birth certificates, 970 of which were for children
- ♦ Provided 2,449 toiletry care kits and 2,659 bag lunches
- ♦83% of guests reported that they live in St. Louis City, vs. 17% in St. Louis County
- ◆46% of guests reported that they were currently experiencing homelessness
- ♦42% of guests reported that they were formerly incarcerated
- ◆The top reasons for needing an ID and/or birth certificate were (in order): Employment, Housing, Applying for Benefits, Health Needs, School, and Cashing Checks

SEASON OF CREATION

From Sept. I - Oct. 4 Christians around the globe will come together to pray and care for creation during what has been named the "Season of Creation." In 1989 a proclamataion declared September I a World Day of Prayer for Creation for the Orthodox. It was embraced by the major Christian European Churches in 2001 and by Pope Francis for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015, when he extended the World Day of Prayer to the "Season of Creation".

As Catholics we are accustomed to celebrating the various liturgical seasons throughout the Church year. The newly-proclaimed "Season of Creation" (although not an official liturgical season), offers us the chance to focus our attention on God the creator and to reflect on our human responsibility as creatures of Earth to serve and protect all of life. The timeframe precedes Oct. 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron of ecology. This is a time for us to pray in gratitude to God for the gift of creation, to learn about *integral ecology*, and to take concrete actions to care for Earth.

The Circle of Creation Committee has prepared cards with Pope Francis' "Prayer for Our Earth" from his encyclical *Laudato Si* for you to take home and pray each day of this season. They are on the tables near the church doors. Also, the song we are using at Mass this week and next is *The Peace of the Earth*, which invites us to experience the peace present in all of creation. Spend some time this week just being in nature and allowing it to refresh your soul!
