FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This weekend is the civil holiday of Labor Day. It is a bit strange that a day that recognizes something nearly all of us engage in, namely work, resonates so little in our cul-



ture. This is primarily viewed as the end of summer rather an opportunity to reflect upon something central to our lives.

However, that may be changing. There seems to be a greater desire for our nation to reflect upon issues around work, inequality and meaningful labor. There is much concern about the widening gap between haves and have nots in our economy. It is one of the few areas of agreement across political lines that life for many Americans is not improving.

Catholic social teaching places a great emphasis on the idea that human laboring and creativity flows from our relationship with God the Creator of all. One of St. Ignatius of Loyola's favorite verbs for God is "laboring". God is at all times working out salvation. Creation is ongoing and directed towards its final end in God. All is directed, guided and brought together by the Spirit of God at work.

There is not a Catholic economic system. Instead, there are values we hold that should be found in any just labor structure. Foremost is the recognition of human dignity. The economy is made for people; people are not made for the economy.

LIGHTWORKS - AN EXPERIENCE OF IGNATIAN PRAYER

LIGHTWORKS is a "light form of work," a series of limbering up exercises for the spirit. Physical exercises build muscle, increase stamina, and develop flexibility. So LIGHTWORKS does for the spirit.

These exercises of prayer and reflection, build our relationship with God and help us become more aware of God's presence in our lives. It consists of weekly group sessions. Participants are given scripture passages or reflections from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to pray



over each week. These invite us into conversation with God about our lives. Then during the weekly session, there is sharing about these passages and a presentation. There are 16 weekly sessions with eight before Thanksgiving and eight in the new year. LightWorks will be offered at St Louis U High on Oakland this fall on Monday evenings from 6:30 until 8:30 pm, beginning on October 1. Flyers will be available soon at the doorways of the church. Children's Liturgy of the Word for Ages 3 - 10

Children's Liturgy of the Word resumes Sunday, September 9th. This is a program for children in Preschool through Fourth Grade to experience God's presence in the proclamation of the Word during the 10:30 am Mass. Children are called forward after the Opening Prayer. The Presider greets the children and then they process to the Parish Center where they are divided into three groups by age.

The room leaders help the children hear the Word of God and nurture their response in prayer, praise and Christian living. The children return to the Congregation following the Prayers of the Faithful. Any child in the designated age range is welcome, no pre-registration is required.

Note: We have new age guidelines for the program this year with Fourth Grade being the upper level for participation.

Outreach Program Updates

Our Outreach Program provides twice-weekly assistance with obtaining Missouri State ID cards and birth certificates from any state.

Here is a snapshot of what we accomplished from July 2017-June 2018:

•Saw 3,421 guests in our twice-weekly walk-in hours

•44% of guests reported that they had been recently released from prison or jail

•46% of guests reported that they were currently experiencing homelessness (all guests have low incomes)

•Assisted with 2,249 Missouri State ID cards, 1,536 of which were paid for by SFX and 713 of which were paid for through the state for eligible individuals who need their ID for voting in Missouri

•Assisted with 2,560 birth certificates from any state, 870 of which were for children under 16

- •Provided 2,593 toiletry care kits and 2,699 bag lunches to guests
- •Guests most commonly reported needing their IDs and/or birth certificates for the following reasons (in order): Employment, Housing, Applying for Benefits, Voting, Medical/Health Needs, School, and Cashing Checks
- •Spent a total of \$52,100 on the cost of IDs and birth certificates for program guests. We saved \$7,843 on the cost of State IDs through facilitating voting-eligible guests accessing state funding for their ID.



ADULT FAITH FORMATON

Living the Christian Life: Once you are 'initiated,' then what?

We watched in wonder as they were baptized. They have spent months reading, reflecting on their lives, praying and developing a relationship with God so that they could be dynamic Christians. Now how do they (and we wonder if we too) more fully integrate this discipleship into our lives in an ongoing way? "How can I deepen this relational experience with Christ?" A process known as *mystogogical* reflection is one way. Mystagogy comes from the Greek word for reflection on how the mysteries (sacramental and liturgical) interact with our lives. When you take a line from the Sunday scriptures or the homily and reflect on how you can better live it, you are doing a mystogogical reflection. Want some help with doing this? The parish offers a weekly reflection group between the Sunday morning masses to help us with this. The group meets from 9:30-10:20 am each Sunday in the St. Ignatius Room on the main floor of the Pastoral Center, beginning this fall on September 16. Bicentennial Lecture Series Continues September 24th With Ignatian Insights for 'Reimagining Health Care'

The Saint Louis University Bicentennial Lecture Series, "The Jesuit Influence in American Spirituality, Education and Society," continues with the Monday, September 24 presentation, "Reimagining Health Care: Ignatian Insights for Achieving the Greater Good." Michael Rozier, SJ, assistant professor of health management and policy at SLU will speak. The presentation will be held 7-8:30 p.m. at St. Francis Xavier College Church, Grand and Lindell boulevards. A light reception follows. Free parking is in the Laclede Garage, at Laclede Avenue and Grand Boulevard.

Rosier has a long history of working with communities of need, including the homeless, incarcerated, and refugees, both in the U.S. and in Latin America. A SLU alumnus, Rozier earned his doctorate in health management and policy at the University of Michigan. He also earned a graduate degree in international health systems from Johns Hopkins University. From 2008-11, Rozier taught global health and public health ethics at SLU and was the founding director of undergraduate education at SLU's School of Public Health.

The series closes on November 5 when Michael Garanzini, SJ, Secretary of Higher Education, Society of Jesus in Rome, speaks on Jesuit Education: Do We Need a New Paradigm?
