**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

Alfred Delp was a German Jesuit executed by the Nazis at the end of World War II. While imprisoned during Advent of 1944 he wrote a series of meditations on the season that have become a classic. I recommend highly giving them a read.

Delp states in one reflection, "There is nothing we modern people need more than to be genuinely shaken up. Where life is firm we need to sense its firmness; and where it is unstable and uncertain and has no basis, we need to know this, too, and endure it." As a witness to the catastrophe war had unleashed, Delp attacked the false security of human control.

Advent was the perfect time to recognize God's shaking action, according to Delp. The readings from Isaiah imagine a radical re-orientating of all reality. Complacency and stability are changed forever by the power of God at work. Something new is being born.

The question is whether we will accept this. Delp writes, "If we want Advent to transform us, then the great question for us is whether we will come out of the convulsions of our time with this determination: Yes, arise! It is time to awaken from sleep. a waking up must begin somewhere. It is time to put things back where God intended them."

The coming of the Messiah changes everything. It is impossible to welcome Christ without acknowledging we are being shaken out of our lethargy. We are witnesses to God's action. Behold, I make all things new.

## Social Ministry Christmas Appeal + Beyond 2020 Campaign

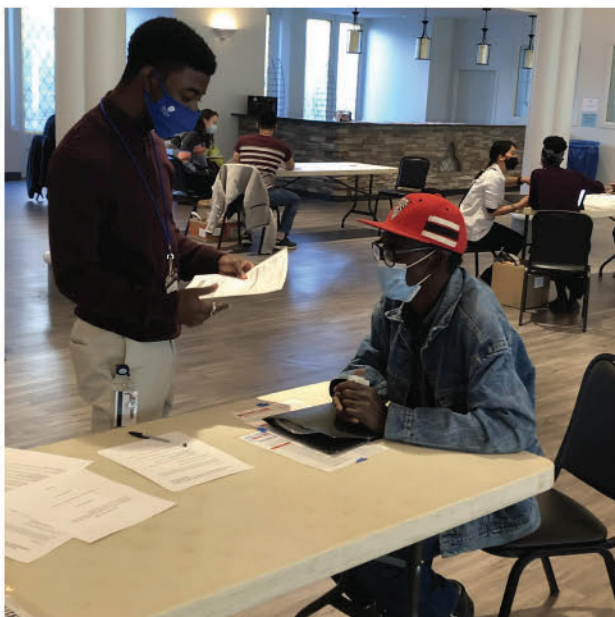


Every year at Christmas, we reach out to our parish community for specific support that helps to sustain our work over the coming year through the Social Ministry Christmas Appeal. As the cornerstone program of Social Ministry, the Outreach Program for ID and birth certificate assistance relies on your end of year contributions in a particular way.

After closing the doors of our Outreach Program for three months earlier this year due to the coronavirus pandemic, we were able to reopen on a weekly basis with COVID-safe procedures in June and continue to ensure that members of our community who experience poverty and homelessness can obtain the vital documents they need to move forward with their lives. This work is more important than ever, as we have seen the number of people seeking our services rise each week.

We are proud that our program offers a unique service, providing the only large scale, consistent identification assistance in the region. The pandemic has highlighted more than ever the need to sustain this work, while also prompting us to reimagine how we might one day grow our ministry beyond the four walls of our parish. This year for our Christmas Appeal, we have two opportunities to help us both sustain and grow our State ID and birth certificate ministry in the region:

1. **Help us sustain our work through the Social Ministry Christmas Appeal:** As always, we rely on your financial support each year in order to continue to carry out the service and justice work that is so integral to the life of the parish. This year is no different. Please consider making an end of year gift to Social Ministry to support the ongoing service and justice work of the parish. 2. **Help us grow our work through the Beyond 2020 Campaign:** This year, we also have a special request outside of our regular Christmas Appeal called our Beyond 2020 Campaign. The Outreach Program received a grant for the express purpose of evaluating ways to expand our ID and birth certificate program. The Brown Sisters Foundation, a faith-based funder who partners with organizations to increase their impact, will provide a matching grant of \$15,000 for new or increased donations to our program. This funding will allow us to hire a part-time Mobile Outreach Coordinator who will explore the opportunities for expanding our work into the wider community and empowering other groups and organizations to collaborate with us in our identification access work.

Sales of fair trade products have resumed **online only** to benefit St. Peter Claver in Punta Gorda, Belize. Because of the pandemic, as well as a series of fires which destroyed farms in the community, unemployment in the area has increased dramatically. All the proceeds from our Fair Trade sales go directly to St. Peter Claver.

So far, we have contributed toward their food pantry and two student scholarships.

Fall items are available, including soups, cornbread, hot cocoa, and baking cocoa, in addition to our ongoing sales of chocolate, tea, and coffee!

Hand Delivery (only for orders of \$20 or more): One of our volunteers will deliver your products to your porch or in front of your home. If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value): Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer's name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

Mary Church Terrell was born on September 23, 1863 in Memphis, Tennessee. Although Mary's parents were born into slavery, they became one of the wealthiest African American families in the country. Because of this Mary received an excellent education, graduating from Oberlin College in Ohio. An act of injustice toward one of Mary's best friends caused Mary to spend her life fighting for people to be treated equally. Mary helped start and became the first president of The National Association of Colored Women. They used the motto "lifting as we climb."

Mercy Conference and Retreat Center and the Office of Racial Harmony for the Archdiocese of St. Louis invite you to join them in a virtual prayer service to reflect upon how the Incarnation guides the faithful in the work of racial justice. ## Green Corner



The holiday season and the annual shopping frenzy have begun. While making purchase decisions, take a moment to consider whether the items you plan to buy are made from or packaged in single-use plastic.

Although the plastic industry promotes its products as being recyclable, many types of plastic—especially the kinds bearing the numbers 3, 4, 6, and 7 in the triangle-shaped recycling symbol that usually appears on the bottom of the product -- are not. What's more, an estimated 90 percent of the types of plastic that are recyclable – mainly numbers 1, 2 and 5 – are, for various reasons, never recycled. What this means is that most plastic products end up in a dump or a waterway.

It's not always possible to avoid plastic products or plastic packaging, but we can be mindful about our purchases and limit the number of non-essential single-use plastics we buy. By doing so, we can not only reduce the amount of waste we produce, but also make the world a less-polluted place for those we love.

Wouldn't that be a great and enduring gift?
